At the time of writing this, we are still preparing for the swimming carnival. We have put on additional staff for the event and I would like to thank the team of teachers & staff who have put in additional hours so the event can go smoothly. We thank all the families and children for being sun smart today by applying sunscreen, wearing broad brim hats and applying sunscreen throughout the day.



Parking

I have had a few inquiries about our car parking. To assist with the flow of driving through the school and parking, the school has worked with and is continuing to work with the Directorate, Walk and Ride and with the Transport section of ACT Government to best meet most people's needs. Work is underway with the building of a gravel carpark for staff at the preschool end of the school. This will supply 17 car spaces for staff and free up 17 spaces for parents and community. We have asked any trades people to not park over numerous car spaces and to alter work hours to not clash with our peak pick up and drop off times. Preschool pick up and drop off is 15 minutes before the main school so that the carpark can be used in a better manner. We encourage you to consider walking or riding to school, especially if you have older children or like to stroll in the sunshine. Our bike enclosure has been upgraded so it is covered and we have a large fixed bike pump available. A number of families are now using nearby parking around the area in streets, the shops carpark and the community hall carpark. Maybe you could consider car pooling with another family at convenient times. This is a great way to get to know others in our community. Every bit assists.



YEAR 5 /6 PATHWAYS

Pathways

Pathways is a secure career and transition website containing three Plans. Pathways assists young people with their career planning and aims to support them in times of transition. The three Plans are designed to meet the developmental needs of young people and provide them with online interactive activities which allow them to reflect on who they are, identify their interests, set goals, practise decision making and develop their Plan. Pathways can be accessed anytime from a range of devices including smart phones, tablets and PCs. Every young person in the ACT is invited to take the opportunity to develop their own personalised career and transition Plan on Pathways.

Links and résumé builder

All three Plans provide links to quality career development, education and training websites. Both the Pathways Plan (7–10) and the 11–12 Plan feature a résumé builder. Information entered by the young person into the 'My achievements' section of the Pathways Plan and 11–12 Plan, is captured to generate a formatted résumé.

5–6 Plan

The 5–6 Plan encourages students in years 5–6 to learn about who they are and think about who they wish to become. This is the foundation for young people to make confident, optimistic and successful decisions about their future.

Interactive activities allow young people to develop self-knowledge, record their strengths and interests, set goals and develop a Plan. It focuses on assisting young people to make a smooth transition from primary to secondary school.

Although the Plan belongs to the young person and they are the only person who can interact with it, young people are encouraged to share their Plan with supportive people around them.

Pathways Plan

What young people believe about themselves and their future opportunities significantly influences the choices they make and the degree to which they are able to achieve their goals.

The Pathways Plan has been developed to support young people in years 7–10 to:

- achieve success
- identify there are many pathways to success
- recognise planning is an important factor in achieving success.

The Pathways Plan builds on a young person's knowledge and experience and asks them to explore possible learning/career/life opportunities, set goals, make considered decisions and take action. It can also help them transition to their next education, training or work destination. The Pathways Plan can be accessed by all young people in the ACT to help them develop an awareness of the importance of planning for their future.

11–12 Plan

Transitioning from year 10 to year 11 and year 12 to post-school destinations are challenging times for many young people. Smooth transitions contribute to a strong foundation for success at school and beyond.

The year 11–12 Plan provides young people with the opportunity to examine their personal, learning, training and career goals, and consolidate their decision making skills. Young people are encouraged to explore their options after year 12 and plan their preferred learning, training and/or employment pathway.

CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY



Think before you park...and keep our kids safe!

With school now back for the year we are encouraging all parents to make parking safety a priority!

This means:

- keep clear of 'no stopping' and 'no parking' zones
- don't park in bus zones, on school crossings, across footpaths or driveways; and
- don't double (or triple) park

Remember - it's okay to park a little further away from the school and walk the rest of the way

Consider - having a pre-determined meeting spot agreed with your kids. That way if you are a little late, they know where to wait.

Think – visibility around schools and if your car may be blocking the view of crossings for other motorists. Also be mindful when entering or leaving parking spots – look twice!

Be kind – to other road users and pedestrians and also if you see any parking officers in the area – they are doing their job and working to keep our kids safe!

Note - licence Plate Recognition (or electronic chalking) vans are now actively monitoring schools.

I would also like to acknowledge the support the P&C, the students and families receive from the amazing school staff. We are very lucky to be part of a school environment with staff that never fail to show their continued, relentless dedication and commitment to our children more often than not, going above and beyond what happens day to day in the classrooms. This support comes from all areas across the school. The administration and maintenance staff, teaching staff, executive staff and of course from our wonderful leaders Deputy Principal Kate Flynn and Principal Melissa Travers.

Without this dedicated support and approach the Community would not be the flourishing environment that it is today. Rail Ready

→ Are you Rail Ready?

Our light rail is fast approaching. Are you Rail Ready?

We are reaching an exciting stage of the light rail project, with the installation of poles, overhead wire and testing of electrical systems and vehicles.

Overhead Wire

Light Rail Vehicles (LRV's) run on electricity that is transmitted through an overhead wire.

Poles are erected along the light rail corridor and the wire is connected from pole to pole.

Stay Safe



Look up and keep away!



- The overhead wire is LVE and carries 750 volts of power. It will cause fatal injuries if touched. Always keep a safe distance from the overhead wire and never come into contact with it.
- Make sure that your vehicle/ load does not come into close contact with the overhead wire. If you are unsure, plan your journey ahead and avoid travelling near the light rail route.
- In the event of an emergency, dial 000.

Light Rail Vehicle (LRV) Testing

Each LRV undergoes comprehensive testing to ensure its safe operation. Testing will start at night, with the LRV's operating at low speed.

Over time, testing speeds will increase and take place during the day.

Stay Safe



Look up and keep away!



- LRV's can move quickly and quietly so always check your environment at intersections and crossings.
- Pedestrians should only cross roads at designated intersection crossings.
- Keep off the tracks—only authorised vehicles may travel on the tracks.
- Remember to follow all road rules when driving or cycling near light rail.

Light Rail → Facts

Overhead Wire (OHW)

The OHW will be strung in lengths of about a kilometre long.

The height of the OHW is around 8.1m along the route and 6.65m at intersections, and is well above the Australian standard of 5.64m.

Signals

The LRV transmits a GPS signal and emits a radio signal that is picked up by an intrack transponder and transmitted to the control centre.

Receivers on the track pick up this signal to manipulate intersection signals and stations. Staffers at the control centre monitor the LRV's position based on the GPS and rail-system transmissions.

Lights & Sounds

Audible warnings, horn and bell, and high intensity headlights are among the LRV's safety features.


The LRV design is focused on passenger comfort and safety.

The LRV's are very quiet and smooth. Even at 60kmh the noise levels are lower compared to a bus.

LRV Design

The LRV design features low floors, bidirectional operation, and is fully climate-controlled with capacity for more than 200 passengers.

There are two dedicated areas for the storage of bicycles and wheelchairs. Passengers will have free access to the high speed on board Wi-Fi system. Real time CCTV (internal and external) and Emergency Help Points (Intercom) ensure maximum security for passengers and drivers.



Components of Overhead Wire

1. Contact Wire delivers electrical power to LRV's via the pantograph.
2. Cantilever or Steady Arm holds the contact wire in place.
3. Insulators insulate the electrical current from travelling to the ground via the steady arm and the pole.
4. Overhead Wire Pole
5. Pantograph; contact between the pantograph and OHW keeps electricity flowing continuously to the LRV's motors.
