Welcome to our new families joining us for the first time at Palmerston District Primary School, we are thrilled that you have joined our learning community and eagerly await making positive partnerships with you too.

Well, what an unusual, and at times, very distressing January break. We recognise that some of our families would have been directly impacted by the bushfires, hail and smoke. Please reach out to us if there is anything we can do to support your family at any time.

I felt empowered to help my local wildlife by creating several water stations, and delighting in the amount of kangaroos, crows, rosella's, cockatoos and a fox, frequently visit and drink up the water that I become addicted to filling twice a day.

Deputy Principal Message



Marijana Pasalic - Deputy Principal: Inclusion, Diversity and Wellbeing

My mother is a cleaner at Canberra College and at seventy-four years of age is still working full time cleaning at that school. She has always worked hard, sometimes up to three jobs at a time, and has always been motivated by knowing she is making a positive contribution to a community and doing her best to make sure the job was done exceptionally well. Last year my beautiful mother was nominated by

staff at Canberra College for a Children's Week Award. The letter she

received talked about her outstanding contribution to make the school

a safe, healthy and happy environment. It talked about her respectful, good hearted nature and the value placed on all that she does there. It made her feel so good and so proud to hear those words and to know that she was appreciated and making a positive impact. She was literally bouncing around for days afterward. Instead of considering retirement, she wants to continue working and she wants to work harder. It was another level of motivation to keep going.

Our students need to hear that they are doing a great job as well. That we appreciate the contribution they make each day and that we think they are amazing. They need to know we are proud of them. Our staff do this in bucket loads already. I hear it all the time. You may have noticed that there are three tubes on the black top with tokens inside. Each tube collects tokens for certain behaviours that students have been acknowledged for – one tube is for safety acknowledgements, one for respectful acknowledgements and one tube for learner acknowledgements. When students are acknowledged for a job well done, they receive a token. These tokens are called Palmy PALS. Palmy PALS are given to students after staff catch them following our PBL behaviour expectations. When students receive a token, they place it in the corresponding tube – e.g. if a student receives a token for walking on hard surfaces, they will place their token in the safe tube. The important part is not the token itself, but the words students hear when they receive it. The positive feedback for a job well done is very powerful – just ask my mother. Tokens also equal points. These points are collected when names are entered into our whole school wellbeing system. Points accrue to receive awards. More tokens mean further progression along the award track. See below to see what the award system currently looks like.

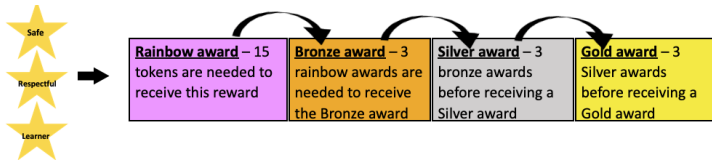
To compliment these awards classroom teachers will also award two students a PRIDE award each fortnight, and students will be publicly congratulated at assembly. Students will also receive certificates for excellent progress or outstanding effort in reading, writing and spelling, these handed out in PODs. We are currently in the trial phase of this system, so things may change. We will share with you the final decisions once we gather feedback from staff and students. If you have any feedback, please feel free to come and see me or email me. Everyone's voice matters. We should have a final decision made by the end of the term.

So far Palmy PALS have been a hit. I have little people running up to me all the time telling me they received a token and what it was for. It truly is wonderful to hear so much positivity in our school. It's contagious.

On a final note, I wanted to welcome everyone back to Palmerston for another wonderful year of learning, laughter and fun! It has certainly been an eventful, sad, and often traumatic Summer. I know many members of our community may have been impacted by the anger of mother nature, or other family circumstances that may have arisen over the break. If you need to talk, or are worried about your child, please feel free contact me. I am really looking forward to my first full year at Palmerston and working hard to make a positive impact on our already wonderful school community.

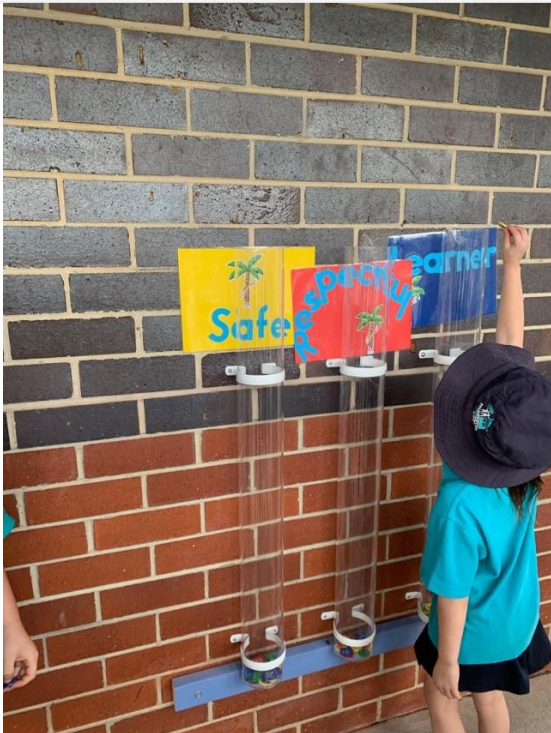

This January, this year, we began our **Curriculum Journey** to develop, deliver and refine a stimulating and conceptually-based differentiated curriculum in each and every classroom.

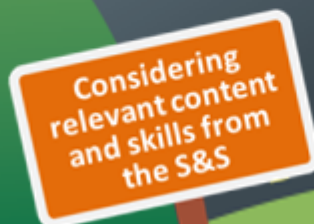
As we review the curriculum goals of our Strategic Plan and Annual Action Plan, we always ask ourselves the following questions:

Car Park Safety

This year we have launched some revised safety procedures in the front car park. You will see four large blue flags, as below, and we are asking for your support to adhere to the message on the flags.

Safety is of paramount importance in the carpark.

This applies to those families only who pick their children up, as pre-arranged by you, from the car park.

FACT: Our carpark has limited parking spots. The below actions are aimed at increasing safety, we need your commitment please to help us.

In 2020 this is what we have in place: Our aim is to **NOT** have children walking on the driving lanes inside the carpark, but rather, crossing the pedestrian crossing, or waiting outside the back of the Hall. The busy time in the afternoon is from 2.50- 3.10pm on average.

- Children being picked up by parents/carers in cars are asked to meet at the Hall end of the carpark with an executive teacher. Cars will flow through the carpark and pull into the designated carparks along the Hall end, and your children will safely hop into the car, ready for you to drive off.
- Principal or exec staff will be on duty until 3.15pm each day at the back of the Hall, there is shade. Rainy days, students can seek cover with supervision under the front entry to the Admin Building.
- Parking inspectors will occasionally be on site. Their role, as in many school car parks is to deter unsafe driving. Frequently, we have drivers making U turns in the carpark, speeding and parking in non-designated areas. Unfortunately there are too many drivers doing this at the point where there is a driveway into the deliveries area. This is very dangerous.
- Fines may take place for unlawful driving/parking, as in any other part of our road system.
- If you have parked your car in one of the legal designated parking spots, please do not cross the traffic flow to get to your car. Please cross the pedestrian crossing and walk safely to your car on the grassed area or concreted area at the front of the cars.
- Please respond positively to our verbal requests to keep the flow of cars moving. It doesn't help anything/anyone to be abusive to the Principal or other staff, who are on duty, with the aim of keeping your children safe.
- Please drive slowly and actively scan the carpark.

Please note these proactive measures already happening:

- Preschool and Kindergarten children have a pick up plan from pods.
- Many families meet their children on the Blacktop and move from there.
- Families have other designated meeting spots away from the immediate school site.

Mr Elks is running an event this weekend called Pop! Goes the Muso.

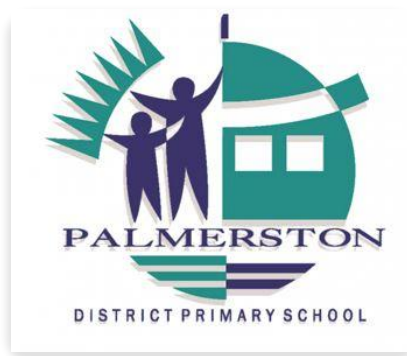
