## Principal



Here at Palmerston District Primary School we are truly lucky to be part of something special. Lucky to have amazing, passionate, dedicated staff. Staff who make the days of our students brighter, calmer and fun. Lucky to have students who come to school and show kindness and a motivation to be the best version of themselves. Lucky to have parents/carers who support our school, provide feedback to make our school a better place, and who show understanding when things are a little tricky. In fact, I was almost brought to tears last week when reflecting on the way our school has come together and supported each other this term. I felt an overwhelming sense of gratitude to everyone who has shown kindness, patience and flexibility.

On another note, a friendly reminder about following the road rules in the car park, particularly during wet weather. While staff members will always try to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students in every setting across the school, we do rely on parents/carers in the community to assist, before and after school, in the car park area. We have also had a couple of cars damaged due to minor incidents. Please follow the direction of traffic when entering and exiting our school car park. Please keep the flow of traffic going and do not leave your car unless it is parked in a designated car park space. If you have been asked by a staff member to move forward, please do so. I am also so pleased that students and staff are back in their pods following remediation works that were completed around the school. I appreciate everyone's flexibility and the manner in which the whole school has come together to support one another. It has been truly remarkable and I am so grateful for the team, for the students and for the community we have here. All areas are now certified and have been cleared as safe zones. I appreciate the quick action from our Directorate to ensure these spaces were treated promptly. While some minor works still need to be completed, such as carpet replacement, I am confident that this will not impact teaching and learning.

We are currently attempting to streamline our communication processes. This is to ensure that there is a consistent approach to our systems and to ensure messages are received and responded to in a timely manner. We are very lucky to currently have two occupational therapist students in our school for eight weeks doing their practicum. They are working with teachers and students to enhance a current play space, bringing in new resources for students to play with. This may look like a loose parts play area, it may look like new games printed on the asphalt, this will all depend on the requests and feedback from students and teachers.

I have also asked them to present us with some ideas for a new sensory play space which would be set up in one of our courtyards. Some additional small play spaces will be greatly welcomed, I have no doubt. The two students have also said they appreciate being in a school and seeing how we make the most of having OTs in our school.

### Coaching and Mentoring at PDPS

At Palmerston District Primary School, we pride ourselves on the coaching and mentoring framework we provide to our New Educators. My role as Coaching Leader is to facilitate the support our New educators need in their formative years of their career. We are incredibly lucky to have wonderful mentors who work alongside our New Educators to co-plan, co-teach, co-debrief and co-reflect on their Professional Practice. Our School Improvement Priorities about providing Positive Behaviours for Learning environments and Improving Spelling and Writing Outcomes are embedded into the Coaching and Mentoring Framework. Our New Educators have developed Professional goals that address the school priorities, and meetings with mentors work towards achieving their professional learning goals. Each term we have 2 New educator Workshops which are a wonderful opportunity for our New Educators to network, celebrate their successes and reflect and consider the 6 Enabling Pedagogies - Student Centred Learning, Assessment, Targeted Explicit and Scaffolded Instruction, Evidence Based Decision Making, High Expectations and Safe, Supported, Connected and Inclusive Learning Environments. Whilst visiting classrooms we have been able to capture classrooms that reflect all of these pedagogies. Our New Educators are most definitely thriving; ensuring that our Palmerston Forest is becoming healthier thanks to our wonderful mentors and highly engaged teachers. ## **Rostrum**

Rostrum has been running a Primary Schools Speaking Competition for 50 years for schools in the ACT and surrounding areas of New South Wales. Each school is invited to enter one competitor into the competition after running a selection process in their own school.

School Finals are held at each participating school at a time and date of their choosing. School Finals shall select a Winner and Reserve. (The Reserve is needed in case the Winner is unable to attend the Quarter Final).

The Quarter and Semi Finals are held in the evening at a host school. Topics for the Quarter and Semi Finals are provided by Rostrum. Each student speaks for 3 minutes with a warning bell at 2 minutes. Rostrum adjudicators will assess each speech and determine the Winner and Runner Up, both of whom will proceed to the next round.

The Grand Final is held at a prestigious local venue, usually 3 to 4 weeks after the last semi-final. Topics for the Grand Final are different to the earlier rounds, and each finalist speaks for 4 minutes. The Warren Hine trophy is awarded to the winning speaker as determined by the Rostrum adjudicators, whilst in recent years a People's Choice trophy has been also awarded and is decided by vote of the audience.

All competitors at the Quarter Final, Semi-Final, and Grand Final receive a certificate. The Grand Final winner and runner up receive medallions and trophies, and the winning school will receive the Perpetual Shield to hold for the next year.

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
