Could it be term four already? Hasn't this year just flown by! Term four is most certainly a busy one. As I add whole school events, planning sessions, meetings and everything in between to my calendar there is not a lot of time to spare. Our students and staff are also working hard to complete units of work and assessments in preparation for reports, which will be sent home in week eight. With all of this going on, it is most important to ensure we are looking after ourselves and our little people. Engaging in things like mindful activities, a predictable sleep routine and regular exercise can benefit us all so much and can assist our students to be focused and motivated learners. To prepare for each day, one of the best things we can do, and give, to our little people is a healthy breakfast and a nutrition filled lunch box. Not always easy, I know. But, in saying that, research shows that there are specific foods that can improve brain function and concentration. Some food items to consider for lunchboxes this term include;

- Any kind of berry think strawberries, blueberries and blackberries.
- Citrus fruits just like berries, citrus fruits like oranges, can improve your ability to learn and enhance your memory
- Nuts packed with nutrients essential for brain health
- Eggs basically a multivitamin that can improve eye function and mental function
- Fish (e.g. tuna) full of omega 3s which are essential for brain health



#### 2023 Host Families Needed

In 2023 PDPS will be hosting a volunteer Japanese Language Teacher's Assistant (JTA), from Kagoshima University in southern Japan. Takuto is a 23 year old male student with good English skills. During his stay he will be assisting in Japanese language classes every day while also hoping to also improve his English skills.

JTAs are home stayed within the school community and pay a contribution towards food and board of \$190 a week to their host families. Assistants need their own rooms but can share the family bathroom.

This program is widely used in ACT schools (there have been over 100 assistants since 2004) and is of great benefit to both the Japanese program and to the families who become involved. We find that families really enjoy this experience as it allows them to expand their knowledge and understanding of Japan and its' people as well as contribute to the corporate life of the school. This is an ideal way to encourage your children to engage with Japanese language and culture and make lifelong friends.

We are therefore seeking expressions of interest from families who would be willing to host our JTA for a period of 6-10 weeks (eight weeks in ideal) in Terms 2-4.

If you are unable to host for a longer term but are interested in offering weekend stays, emergency back up or the occasional social activity please also return the form below.

#### Future of Education Equity Fund payments for eligible low income families

The closing date for applications for Future of Education Equity Fund payments for eligible low income families has been extended until 31 October 2022.

The Equity Fund provides a one-off payment for the 2022 school year to use towards educational costs such as sporting equipment and activities, musiclessons, school uniforms and excursions.

The ACT Government believes every child regardless of their background should have the same equal chance at a great education and this initiative is one of many that will assist families.

It is open to students from preschool (attached to a school) to Year 12 who live and attend school in the ACT, may be eligible for the payment for the 2022 school year. Families may lodge one online application for all students in their family.




