Loose Parts Play

Over the past 5 weeks we have been learning about how the students at Palmerston like to play and what they want from their playground. We did this by observing students in the playground, conducting a survey, and running workshops.

We found that the students are active, playful, and creative, with majority of students wanting more play materials that they can physically engage with. We took on this feedback and over the school holidays will be implementing a loose parts play area. Loose parts play develops social, creative, and cognitive thinking skills by allowing the children to experiment using their imagination.

We aim to have this space available in the playground in week one for all students to use. It will contain a variety of materials, including tires, pipe, milk crates etc. that they students can build and play with.

Preservice Teachers - The Power of a Healthy Palmy Forest

Mark Grant, CEO of the Australian Institute of Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) advocates for the importance in "ensuring that all 4 million Australian school students experience quality teaching in every classroom, every day, no matter where they are located as critical to Australia's success. This starts with the beginning of the teaching journey, and an important part of that is quality placement experiences for pre-service teachers whether in metro, regional, or remote areas.

What we find is that the pre-service teachers who immerse themselves in the school and local community, who learn about the culture and foster strong working relationships, enjoy a much more positive placement experience. The students they teach benefit from this too. The school community's experience of the placement is just as important as the preservice teacher's learning experience".

At Palmerston District Primary School, we validate and support this messaging by working very closely with Universities across eastern Australia to host and mentor Preservice Teachers to become high quality Graduates. Our goal, along with the Coaching and Mentoring Framework and the New Educator Support program is to build a culture of support and development where our experienced teachers nurture the next generation of teachers. We are so proud of our mentors and the support and guidance they provide to co-plan, co-teach and co-reflect on their teaching practice. This term, I have been able to see wonderful professional practice and engagement from our current Preservice Teachers. I have observed strong collaborative partnerships between mentors, teaching teams and preservice teachers and supportive student/teacher relationships. Thank you to our wonderful mentors and to our preservice teachers. Our school benefits from the experience as much as our preservice teachers.
