This year our school has been incredibly lucky to work alongside Christine Topfer, an Education Consultant and co-author of Guiding Thinking for Effective Spelling. Christine has been an integral part of our journey and has met with staff and our school leadership team to support us in reflecting upon and reviewing how we understand concepts of spelling, phonemic awareness and the way we learn about words. We have really taken a deep dive into exploring many components of the English language and how we, as educators, are establishing a word conscious classroom. Spelling is a thinking activity and there are many parts that make it work. English is not a simple language to learn. It is not as simple as one letter representing one sound. Instead we look for patterns, we connect words, we explore their origin and their meaning and we look at strategies to support this very complex process. The five strategies we have been focusing on to guide thinking for effective spelling are;

- Sound – focusing on hearing and recording sounds
- Visual – noticing letter patterns in words

- Meaning – thinking about the structure, meaning and origin of words
- Connecting – connections we notice between words
- Checking – using resources in the classroom to check our work

There are many ways you can support your child at home to spell and explore words, and compliment what we are doing at school. These can include;

- Stretch words out, say them slowly and ask your child to write the sounds they hear. Ask your child what letter they could write to represent the sound they hear.
- Clap the syllables in words – write the word on paper, cut it up to represent the syllables and ask your child to arrange the sounds in the correct order
- Pick a word and think of other words that rhyme with it
- Help your child notice a combination of letters that make sounds – e.g. ph as in photo, oa as in boat or goat
- Use a dictionary to help you check words at home
- After reading together, explore word patterns and sounds – ask your child to look for words, cover a word and ask them to think of sounds they remember
- Use hands on resources to explore spelling strategies, letters and sounds – e.g. magnetic letters to move letters around, playdough to construct letters and discuss their sounds, writing words in sand
- Read with your child each night

On another note good luck to our Tournament of Minds team, lead by Ms Holt. They will be participating in the competition this weekend at the ANU. Thank you to Ms Holt for her leadership and guidance, and well done to all students participating. Finally, a gentle reminder that the school satisfaction survey is now open. You would have received an email with instructions about how to log on and complete it. We appreciate the time taken to provide your feedback.





### 2022 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey

Each year, the Directorate surveys all parents and carers, school staff and students in Years 4 to 12 about their experience of public education. The 2022 School Satisfaction & Climate Survey will be available online from 19 August to 9 September. The survey results will help us to continue to make quality informed decisions about how to improve our school. No personal identifying information will be provided to any school or college. For each child in their family who attends an ACT public school, parents and carers will receive:

- An email about the parent survey, including a link to access the survey.; and
- A letter about the student survey outlining the reasons for collection and privacy provision for the data

If you do not receive the survey invitation (from the 19 August), please check your Junk email folder; if it is not there, contact the school and you will be provided a survey link. If you do not have an email listed with the school, please contact the office and an alternate arrangement will be made.

The Parents and Carers Survey will be available online in other languages: Arabic, Burmese, Chinese, Hindi, Korean, Urdu, Vietnamese, Punjabi, Bengali, Spanish, Telugu, French and Italian. Respondents can select their preferred language when they start the survey. A shortened paper-version of the Parents and Carers Survey is also available in the following 5 languages: Dari, Dinka, Farsi, Karen and Mon. These surveys will be available at the Front Office. For the results to reflect the opinions of our whole school community, we need as many parents and carers, staff and students as possible to complete the survey. The response is to be no greater than 200 words. The creative writing piece must be the original work of the student and not published anywhere else before. 
