I can't wait to learn more. The

theme for Reconciliation Week reminds me to stay connected to community and country and adopt practices that prioritise cultural safety. It is a call to me to move beyond passive allyship and seek out members of our community we can connect with.

Finally, I would like to thank every student, staff member and parent/carer who has provided me with such beautiful words of encouragement over the course of this term. While this term has certainly thrown some challenges my way I am truly honoured and to be leading such a beautiful community. A community I love so much. Reconciliation Week

National Reconciliation Week⁹ is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for NRW remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

We all have a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories, cultures, and futures.

The theme for 2022 is, 'Be Brave, Make Change'. Change begins with brave actions in your daily life – where you live, work, play and socialise.

Take these Actions to Make Change with you every day of the year, not just during National Reconciliation Week.

Classes at PDPS will be taking part in different learning experiences, including visual art, guided by our newest resource addition, 'Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Art in the Classroom' by the Art Gallery of South Australia. Students across the school will also engage in op portunities to learn and reflect on what Reconciliation means through literacy and class discussions.

RAT TESTS

The ACT Education Directorate will no longer be asking schools to distribute two RAT's per week to students. Instead from the commencement of week 9, RATS will be provided on an as needed basis for all students in ACT schools. Schools will hold a supply of RATS that can be sent home with students at the request of a parent/carer (2 per student) if required or can be collected from the Front Office between 8.30am to 3.30pm.

In the event that your require RAT tests please email info_palmdps@ed.act.edu.au¹² stating:

RAT tests will then be given to your child to bring home and a confirmation email sent to you that this has occurred. If students are not attending school when requesting tests, or are subject to isolation or quarantine requirements, families can make alternative arrangements to collect RATs through a relative, neighbour or other student.


