#### Class Connections - Music

This term in music, year 4, 5 and 6 have been learning about the elements of beat, rhythm, dynamics, pitch and tempo. We have explored a range of percussion instruments, body percussion and tuned to explore these elements and practised these in our warmup games of Mexican Wave, Musical Whispers and Imposter. The students have collaborated to compose music reflecting different stimulus including art works, picture books, fairy tales, Canberra attractions and natural disasters. The music created has been very inspiring with students using different sounds in their compositions.

#### **Band**

The two bands are progressing well. We have had three students transition to the tenor and alto saxophone and bass clarinet. We have been learning new music and developing our skills in reading music and playing our instruments. Combined band practice with Gold Creek school has allowed us to perform and grow as a combined woodwind and brass band, and we enjoy performing to the junior classes after these rehearsals. We look forward to performing at the learning journeys.









#### **Junior Music**

The students in Junior Music have been enjoying songs, music and instruments from around the world. This Term has seem some unique experiences take place during Science Week and Book Week with sound experiments and experimental music making in all classes K-2.

Please also provide a plastic bag for your child to put their wet clothes in after the lesson.







The ACT Instrumental Music Program is seeking students who will be in Years 7-12 in ACT public schools in 2024 to audition for secondary extension ensembles.

Current Year 6 students continuing to a public secondary school in 2024 can apply for:

- Junior Concert Band (Woodwind, Brass, Percussion): Years 7-8 students in ACT public schools in 2024
- Percussion Ensemble (Percussion Only): Years 7-12 students in ACT public schools in 2024
- Senior Concert Choir (Singers): Years 7-12 students in ACT public schools in 2024 Students auditioning for Junior Concert Band and Percussion Ensemble must have previous experience on their instruments. These groups are not suitable for beginners. Students auditioning for Senior Concert Choir may or may not have previous singing experience. Auditions will be held online in Term 4 (30 October 10 November). All audition requirements and pieces will be available on the IMP website by the end of Term 3. The ensembles are an excellent opportunity for hard-working, skilled and committed young musicians to work together in an enriching environment. The groups are active performance ensembles and the families of students auditioning will need to be prepared to make a strong commitment to rehearsal and performance attendance for the year.
