Could it be the end of the school year approaching? My goodness! How? How can this be? It will most certainly be a busy, but joyous and reflective end of the year for us here at Palmerston District Primary School. I am so proud of our staff and students for all they have accomplished and so thankful to our parents and carers who continue to work in partnership with us. It is so evident that every student is at the centre of what we do together. I sincerely hope we continue to grow as a strong community. There are no challenges we can't overcome when we communicate and work together. We all make this school the truly special place it is and I am thankful for each day I get to come to work here.

In Preschool, Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two there were many events that celebrated our students and their creative and sporting skills. What a clever group of students we have! Across the year students were provided time to expand their inquiring minds, share new knowledge and practice new skills. Across many parts of K-2 students expressed much delight in meeting Kenny Koala and learning about how to be safe in the community. A highlight of the visit was the opportunity to see a police car and listen to the siren blast from the speakers. Kenny will back next year, and we cannot wait to welcome him. We had a marvellous Bookweek, the parade always a highlight for me, a fabulous Easter Hat Parade, a groovy incursion from Musica Viva and fantastic sporting events, such as the Athletics Carnival, Cross Country and The Colour Run. We celebrated Science and dressed the part as we became keen detectives and constructors of strong, rigid bridges. We showed off our love of numbers on world Maths Day!

In Preschool, our students have grown up so much across the year. They have explored and played and learned so many new skills. They have demonstrated an inquisitive mind. They have met Healthy Harold and learned about healthy life choices. Preschoolers have experienced so many firsts. So many! A few highlights for me are the first walk outside of school to discover all manner of things in our suburb. There is the first successful mud pie baked in the mud kitchen. The first painting created. The first time 'ice-cream' was served in the classroom 'café'. The first time they were successful in writing their name. So many firsts! Thank you to all families who came on Wednesday night to celebrate such a successful year.

Kindergarten were all systems go throughout 2023. They showed their skills in games of dodgeball and Sumo tips with Mrs Edwards, laughing with utter delight at the fun they were having. Watching the butterfly in class hatch from a chrysalis was also a highlight. Kindergarten became keen, successfully gardeners growing broad beans from seedlings and then spent time each day tracking the growth of each plant and recording observations. So clever! Another mind blowing moment in Kindergarten was the creation of a cardboard city built as part of the inquiry unit about the community. So detailed! So impressive!

Year One had a fabulous year. They certainly proved themselves to have star quality on stage at assemblies each term and shone as learners too. Their inquiry into the past and present saw them exploring items, donated from the Hall Museum, from yesteryear (including a very cool typewriter). They asked questions about what was discovered inside suit cases, researched the objects and looked at how things were different today. They also took time over the year to learn

more about themselves and how they have changed from precious little babies to the confident children we know today. Students in Year One visited Mulligan's Flat and learned about our community and the natural wonders that are at our fingertips. It was certainly a big year one.

Year Two are so ready for their next learning adventure and all the things that will come their way in 2024. They have had a whole year of investigating many different concepts, exploring historical artifacts, such as milk jug covers and rotary phones, and compared them to items we use today. Students designed and created time machines and water filters to answer inquiry questions. Such investigators, scientists, designers and entrepreneurs. They examined the life cycle of meal worms and silk worms and observed how our water cycle works. Students cooked up a storm this term and made some very interesting food items.

Year Two showed us all they were able to be safe in the water and showed exceptional safe, respectful learner behaviours as they travelled to and from the pool.

Phew! That is only a small part of all the fabulous work being done across P-2. What a busy and positively beautiful year! I wish all students graduating from Palmerston all the very best as they leave us to show the world how wonderful they are. I have absolutely loved every minute spent with the stunning students in our school and look further to supporting them and our school community in 2024. I hope you all take the opportunity and time to relax over the Summer break, before preparing the wonderful year to come.


What is a P&C Association?

Community Connections

Give a tree a drink

Have you noticed your neighbourhood street trees recently? Are they thirsty? This summer is going to be hot and dry. We encourage all school students to help protect our urban forest and make our city a great place to live by regularly watering their street trees. Water saving tip: take a bucket in the shower with you, and use the excess, to water the base of a street tree at least once a week. Canberra's incredible trees provides much needed shade, clean our air and provides habitats for local wildlife. Help us protect trees so they can protect us.

The ACT Government has almost 60,000 young trees on the current watering program. While young street trees are watered by the ACT Government regularly to ensure their establishment and survival, the community can help by giving their local trees a drink over summer.
