Watching our students interact on the playground and in the classroom is a beautiful thing. Whether it be discussing the joys and mysteries of their lives, conferencing with their teacher or greeting a parent at the gate after school, our students are proving they are on their way to be great communicators. With each interaction, and with support and explicit teaching, their speaking and listening skills are always improving. Our children learn by listening, participating and watching. At school we are always busy developing these skills with students in social and educational ways. We make minutes matter and find any, and every opportunity, to engage in teachable moments. Speaking and listening opportunities are created all the time at school in formal and informal ways, for educational and social reasons. We practice turn taking, we listen to class presentations, we role play. We use visual representations of more complex ideas, such as classroom timetables. We use short, simple instructions when needed and scaffold skills and learning when things become a little more complex. We work with students to build their problem solving skills through the use of appropriate questions and support collaboration and team work. We resolve conflicts together and unpack words to describe how we are feeling. This, and so much more, happens at our school all the time, and our students work hard to display these skills consistently.

At home you can improve the language and communication skills of your child by;

- Reading and talking with your child each day
- Ask questions that require more than a yes or no response
- Ask your child to repeat instructions to you
- Find everyday opportunities to model talking and listening skills – e.g. Take a walk around the neighbourhood and ask your child what they see, smell, hear and feel
- Draw pictures together and tell stories about what you have drawn
- Watch age appropriate television shows and discuss the content, or play a board game together
- Plan events, such as birthday parties, together
- Model body language – e.g. Nod, smile and gesture when your child is talking about a topic of interest to them.

Speaking and listening skills are life long skills. These skills help our students to develop empathy, to become aware of others and the environment and assists students to gain information needed to build our knowledge and skills. Speaking and listening skills are important and a continual focus for all students here at Palmerston District Primary School.

I would like to thank students who participated in the ICAS testing over the past three

weeks. They certainly tried their best and results should be provided to us soon. NAPLAN results will be sent home early next week. While we appreciate the information that a NAPLAN result provides, the classroom teacher will have the best insight into the progress of your child. Finally, one of the highlights of my week continues to be the student visitors who pop up to the office during the day. These students come to share completed work they are especially proud of, or discuss whole school initiatives they would like to promote or students who have been safe, respectful learners on the playground and in class. It makes me proud to be part of such a wonderful school community.

Indigenous Literacy Day – Wednesday 7 September 2022

Taking place on the first Wednesday of September each year, Indigenous Literacy Day (ILD) raises awareness of educational barriers impacting First Nations groups in Australia, while also serving as a fundraiser to collect literary resources for children living in more isolated areas of the country.

Providing more than just books, ILD celebrates Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders cultures and the stories and languages that helped to build the country we know today. Indigenous literacy is important not just for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, but for everyone to ensure we preserve our unique heritage and create opportunities for fellow Australians.

The Indigenous Literacy Foundation who host ILD are a not-for-profit charity which respects the unique place of Australia's First People and draws on the expertise of the Australian book industry. Indigenous Literacy Day at Palmerston

To acknowledge the importance of ILD, several classes across Palmerston took part in a special online event hosted by the Sydney Opera House. A lively group of children from remote Milikapiti and Jilkminggan Country in the Northern Territory, joyfully shared their Stories, Cultures and Languages through a 20-min story.

All classes across Palmerston were encouraged to read stories by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Authors. At Palmerston, we have a growing collection of authentic First Nations books, including books from diverse First Nations communities, bilingual texts and picture books that link naturally to everyday learning.

Mrs Denmead and Mrs O'Kane's Year 1 classes read the books, 'When We Go Walkabout' by Rhoda Dugurrru Lalara and 'Little Birds Day' by Sally Morgan. The children went for a walk to find birds around the school, followed by engaging in a writing task inspired by Little Birds Day. Both classes also used the Aboriginal Australia Map to acknowledge Country through their learning.
